The strength of our smaller Sixth Form is that every student is known and benefits from our one-to-one academic tutoring and is able to take advantage of the care and support we are able to offer beyond the classroom environment. We know how important this is in developing the confidence and resilience of our young people and we are with them every step of the way, so they can achieve their ambitions. For many students though, it is normal to be uncertain about what they want their next steps to be. By exposing them to a range of external speakers, lecturers, employers, universities, UCAS exhibitions and trips, we do our best to help them gain an insight into the wider world and the wonderful opportunities available, not only locally but nationally and globally. We also have an independent careers advisor, who the students can book one-off, or a series of appointments with. EXCELLENT ENRICHMENT AND OPPORTUNITIES



We offer a range of academic enrichment, societies, volunteering and sport in the Sixth Form, both during and after the school day. As part of the Sixth Form curriculum we also provide a timetabled Personal Development programme which teaches and refines invaluable life skills and fortnightly enrichment programmes which students must select from. These super-curricular programmes enable our students to learn beyond the examined curriculum and gives them the opportunity to explore new things – whilst enhancing their CVs.

There are focused programmes to support all career paths. The most popular in recent years have been our MedPrep, aptitude test guidance, UCAS support (both application and personal statement), as well as accredited enrichment such as the EPQ or Core Maths. Whether students wish to secure an apprenticeship, employment or a university place, all are equally valued here and we will work with each student to ensure that they achieve their goals.

Holyrood is one of the most successful completion centres for the delivery of the Duke of Edinburgh Award in the region. The Gold Award is undertaken in the Sixth Form.
