

TURNING IN TO TEENS | PARENTING PROGRAMME

Dear Parent/Guardian,

You are invited to take part in a free programme that aims to help you and your adolescent manage the many emotional challenges of this stage of life. Tuning in to Teens is a six-week parenting programme. The programme will teach you how to manage your own and your adolescents' emotions in ways that help you to remain close and keep communicating. By learning these skills, you are less likely to have as much conflict within your family and your teen is more likely to talk to you about the challenging issues they face. These are factors that have been found to reduce the risk of mental health and substance abuse problems.

What is Emotional intelligence?

The programme is based on the concept of Emotional Intelligence. Emotional Intelligence (EQ) is about using your emotions to guide you through the world. It is about being able to use your own knowledge of emotions to make decisions, to calm yourself down, to manage anger and conflict, to help you in your relationships with people, to know what is happening in social situations, and to assist you in many aspects of life where you or another person are involved.

Why is Emotional Intelligence important?

Research has shown that teens with greater emotional intelligence:

- are more aware, assertive and strong in situations of peer pressure
- have greater success with making friends and are more able to manage conflict with peers
- are more able to cope when upset or angry
- have fewer mental health and substance abuse difficulties
- have more stable and satisfying relationships as adults

 have greater career success. Emotional Intelligence may be a better predictor of academic and career success than IQ.



When parents focus on helping their teen learn about emotions, the young person is more likely to have higher emotional intelligence. In this parenting programme we will teach parents what to do to help these skills develop, and in doing so we expect teens to manage adolescence better.

ACUTE HOSPITAL-BASED STROKE SERVICES PUBLIC CONSULTATION 18-25 YEAR OLDS

Background:

Stroke is a sudden and life-changing event and is a leading cause of death and disability in the UK. Over recent years, there have been significant advances in proven, highly effective methods of stroke treatment and care.

NHS Somerset is running a public consultation to gather feedback about the future of acute hospital-based stroke services in Somerset, from people living in Somerset and people who use Somerset hospitals. Acute hospital-based stroke services is the specialist hospital care people receive in the first few days and weeks when they first have a stroke.

We're committed to understanding the needs of our local population to make sure we can continue to deliver the best possible health and care services in Somerset.

The public consultation runs from Monday 30 January 2023 for 12 weeks until midnight on Monday 24 April 2023.

We need to ensure that we are hearing a diverse range of voices and this includes the views of young people in Somerset.

In lessons this term with Art, Music & Drama...

Exploring colourand perspective has led to some impressive watercolourlandscapes by Year 7 this term and we could not be prouder of our Tim Burton inspired Year 8 work which became the backdrop to The Adams Family Musical. Mixed Media has been the medium for Year 9 artists as they explore the theme of the microscopic world. KS3 drama students have been developing their skills in creating drama work with Year 7's fantastic slap stick pieces in 'Silent Movies', Year 8's devising from stimulus and Year 9 students learning how to 'hook' an audience through dramatic techniques and conventions. Theatre creation has also followed through into drama lessons with exploring the roles and responsibilities of those working in professional theatre (Year 8) and the screening of live theatre performance with Year 9 watching The National Theatres 'Small Island'. Music has had a 'show' theme this term with Year 7 creating ostinatos from Harry Potter, Year 8 delving into Musical Theatre and Year 9 composing their own film soundtracks using our new mac suite to learn more about music technology –the results have been epic! All of our KS4 & 5 students studying qualifications in the arts are now heavily into exam preparation, but a huge congratulations on the performances, compositions and art work that has been submitted so far as part of the course –Holyrood has talent!















Creative trips and workshops this term...

There has certainly been plenty of opportunities outside of the classroom for creativity this term! Our fabulous Art team has ventured into the city with trips to Exeter RAMM and London's Tate Gallery where students have been exposed to artists and artifacts to inspire their own work at GCSE & A Level. Drama have also explored the capital with Year 11 for our annual trip to watch 'The Woman in Black', a very special occasion as this show now ends its run on the west end after 30 years! Selected Year 8 students had full run of The Octagon Theatre in Yeovil where they had a private backstage tour and a workshop with the acclaimed Somerset Youth Dance Company. We were also proud to visit Restart Primary School this term with our drama enrichment class who performed their own versions of 'The Highway Rat' to KS1 students which was wonderful to see. Our creative work in the community continued this term through working with Richard Tomlinson on a green screen and dance project that was exhibited in March with silhouettes of year 8 students projected on the Guildhall. We also welcomed back the Jackdaw music project for schools and students from Years 7 –13 have been rehearsing for the Klezmer music project; a series of Jewish pieces for an ensemble on the 28thMarch.


