I would like to say a huge thank you to all of the parents, carers, staff, students and volunteers who made our recent performances of Shrek The Musical so successful. I was so proud of the 120 students who were involved in such a high-quality production. I thought that Grease! was the best school production I had ever seen, until I saw The Addams Family, last year. I didn't think it was possible for Shrek to be better, but it was! I was most pleased that the cast was bigger and so many children were involved in singing, acting, tech crew and lighting as well as in costume and stage design. If your child is considering getting involved in Performing Arts but doesn't quite have the confidence yet, please ask them to have a chat with someone who was in Shrek this year, or to go and see their Art, Music or Drama teacher who will be happy to support them to join a club. It would be amazing to see even more children involved next year.

On a different note and as you are already aware, our uniform consultation has closed and we have made the following decisions:

- 1. That we will move to a new school skirt of tartan style from 1st September 2024. This will be for Year 7-10 inclusive but next year's Year 11 students (this year's Year 10) will not be made to buy a new skirt. They may if they wish to. We are currently consulting with students on the different cuts of skirts available as well as the pattern itself. More to come on this over the next few weeks.
- 2. That the blazer will remain a compulsory part of the uniform. The majority of parents and carers as well as staff felt that it would be a step backwards to remove the blazer from the uniform. A valid point raised by the students was that blazers are useful for storage (pockets!) and for wearing their reward badges.
- 3. That the choice to have a branded school jumper or a plain black woolen jumper will also remain and that both of these items are optional. Most people felt that the increased cost of a branded jumper was not wanted, particularly in light of the increased cost of a skirt. Therefore, we will not take this aspect of the consultation forward.

Thank you, as always, for all of your support of the school. I understand that we do not always get everything right and that sometimes, young people can be unkind to each other (particularly online). If you have a concern, please contact us directly. It is rather difficult to deal with issues that are raised via Facebook, particularly if that is the first we know of them. Similarly, if you would like to come and visit us during the day to see what Holyrood is really like, please email me directly at dmaccormick@holyrood.bep.ac. I would be delighted to show you around personally on a day that suits you. This is a great school and we are very proud of our students and staff.


If a book has been lost or damaged, please don't worry as we are happy to accept a good quality second-hand copy as a replacement.




