

A LEVEL LAW

Areas of Study...

Paper 1: Criminal (and assigned topics from the Nature of Law and the English Legal System)

General elements of liability; fatal and non-fatal offences against the person; property offences; attempts; and defences.

Paper 2: Tort (and assigned topics from the Nature of Law and the English Legal System)

Liability in negligence for physical injury, damage to property, economic losses and psychiatric injury; occupiers' liability; nuisance and the escape of dangerous things; vicarious liability; defences; and remedies.

Paper 3: Contract (and assigned topics from the Nature of Law and the English Legal System)

Essential elements of an enforceable contract; contractual terms including those implied by statute into consumer contracts and exclusion clauses; misrepresentation; economic duress; discharge of contracts; and remedies.



Assessment

The A Level is made up of 3 x 2 hour written exams (one for each paper) of equal weighting, sat at the end of two years of study.

Future Careers

As well as careers as solicitors and barristers other careers include legal executives, consumer advice, business, law enforcement roles with the police, trading standards and the environment agency.
